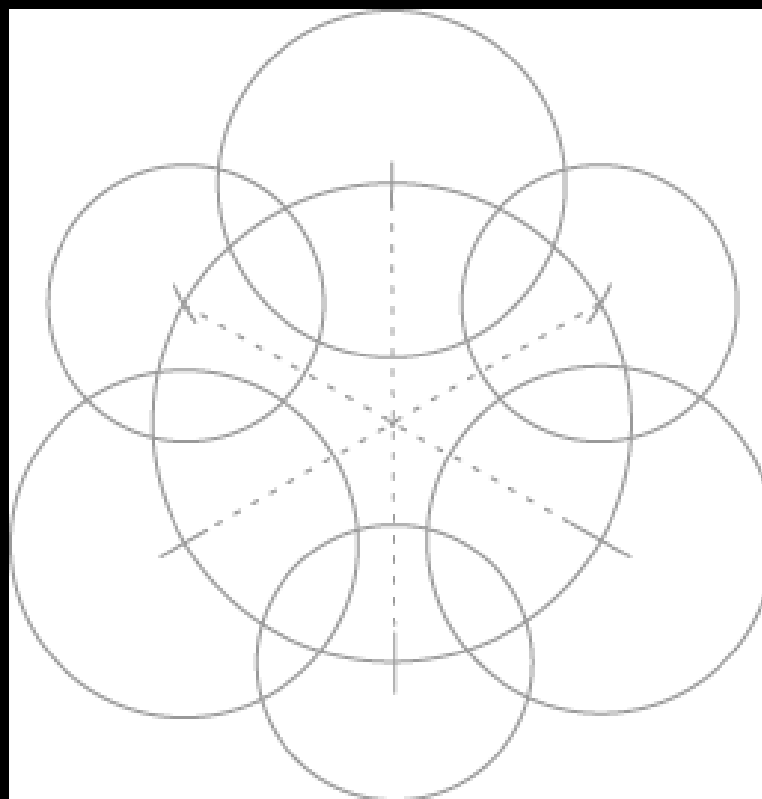


Colour Wheel



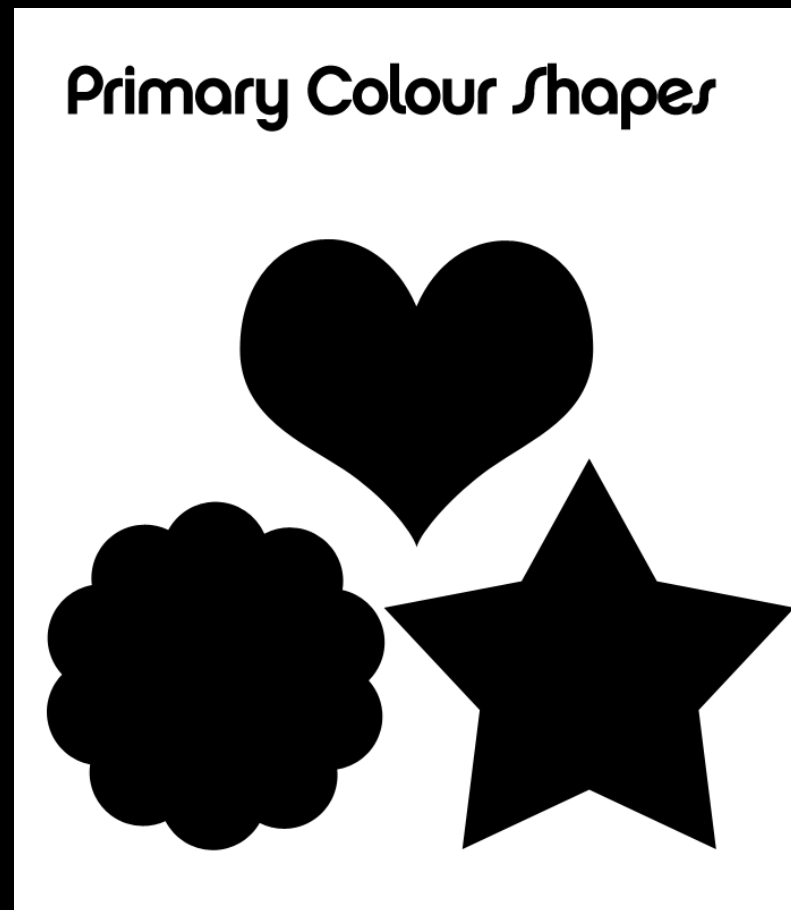
Colour Wheel

Step 1 - use the circles as a reference



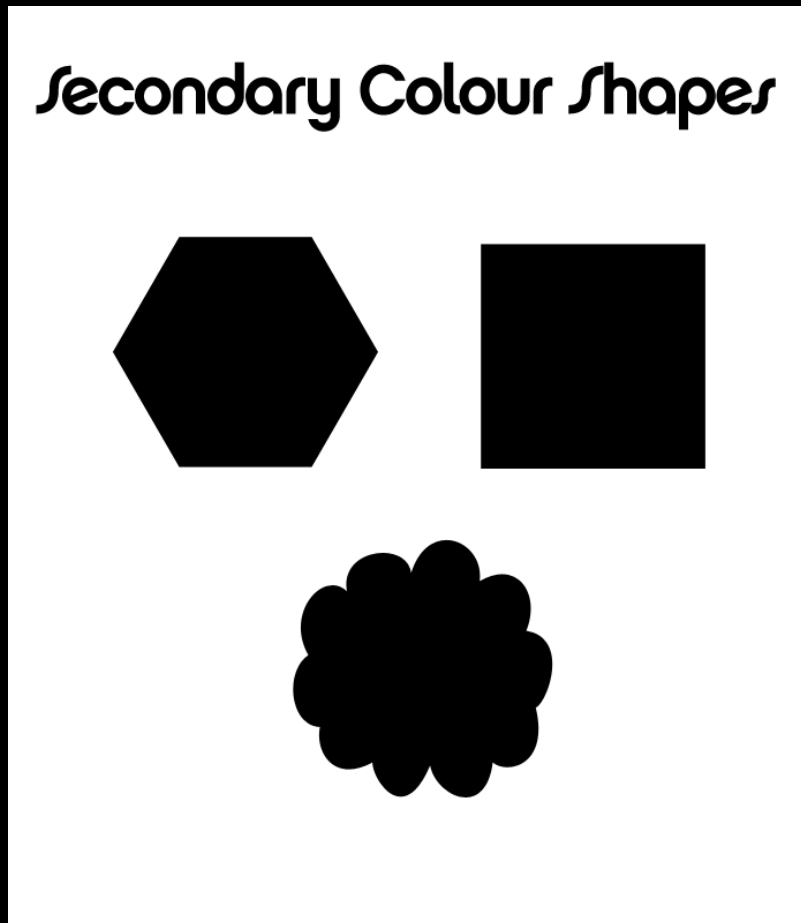
Colour Wheel

Step 2 - cut out a big shape for the primary colours or create your own

Step 3 - cut out a smaller shape for the secondary colours or create your own



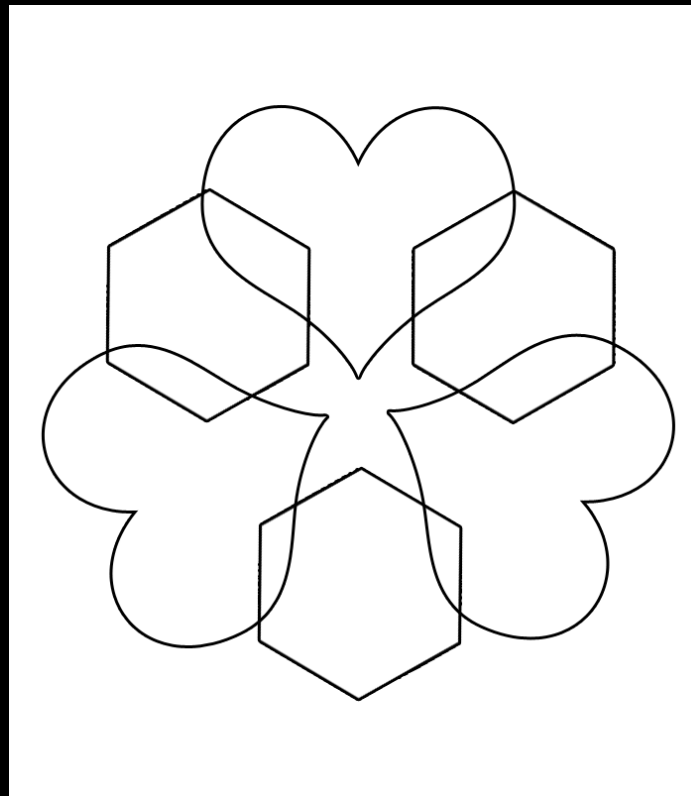
Colour Wheel

Step 5 - painting - colour in the primary colours first (don't overlap).. then secondary then tertiary..

Step 4 - arrange the shapes using the circles as a guide and draw over them - we want a line drawing in our notebooks a bit like this...



Colour Harmonies

1. Make a stencil on heavy card

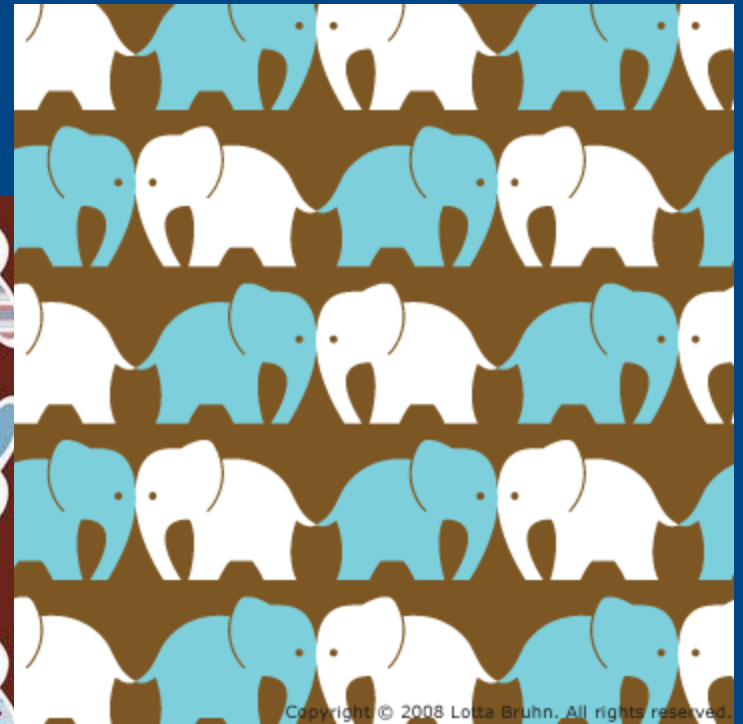

Colour Harmonies

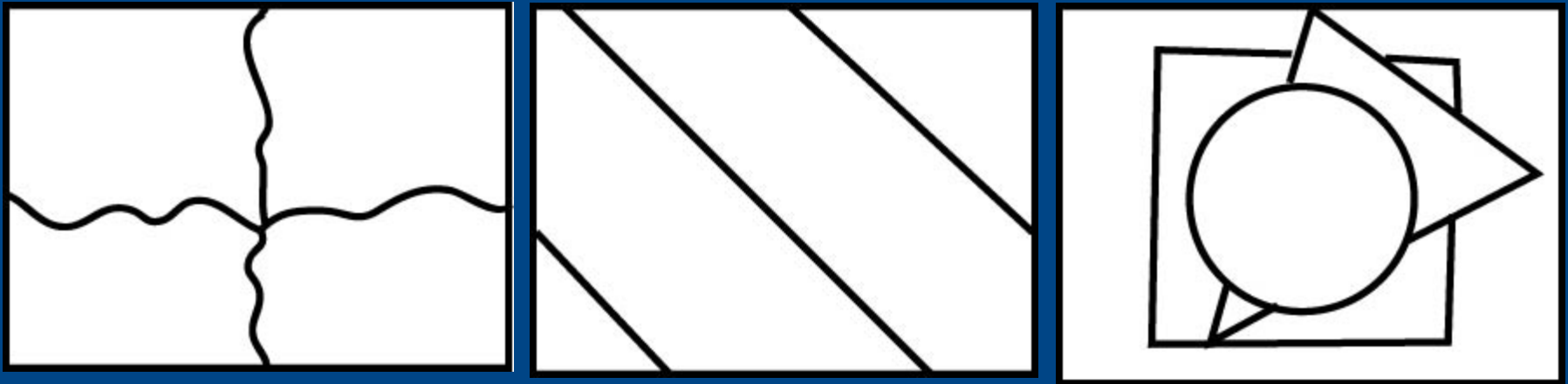
1. Trace and repeat the stencil on larger paper to create an interesting pattern/design

3. Divide the large piece of paper into 4 pieces - any shape, size or proportion



Colour Harmonies

4. Paint each space with a different colour harmony:

MONOCHROMATIC - This colour harmony is created by using one hue from the colour wheel and altering its value with the addition of black, white or gray to create shades, tints, or tones of the hue.

ANALOGOUS - Analogous colours are colours that are found side by side on the colour wheel and are related in that, they are created by mixing the same two primary colours. Red-orange, orange, and yellow-orange are examples of analogous colours.

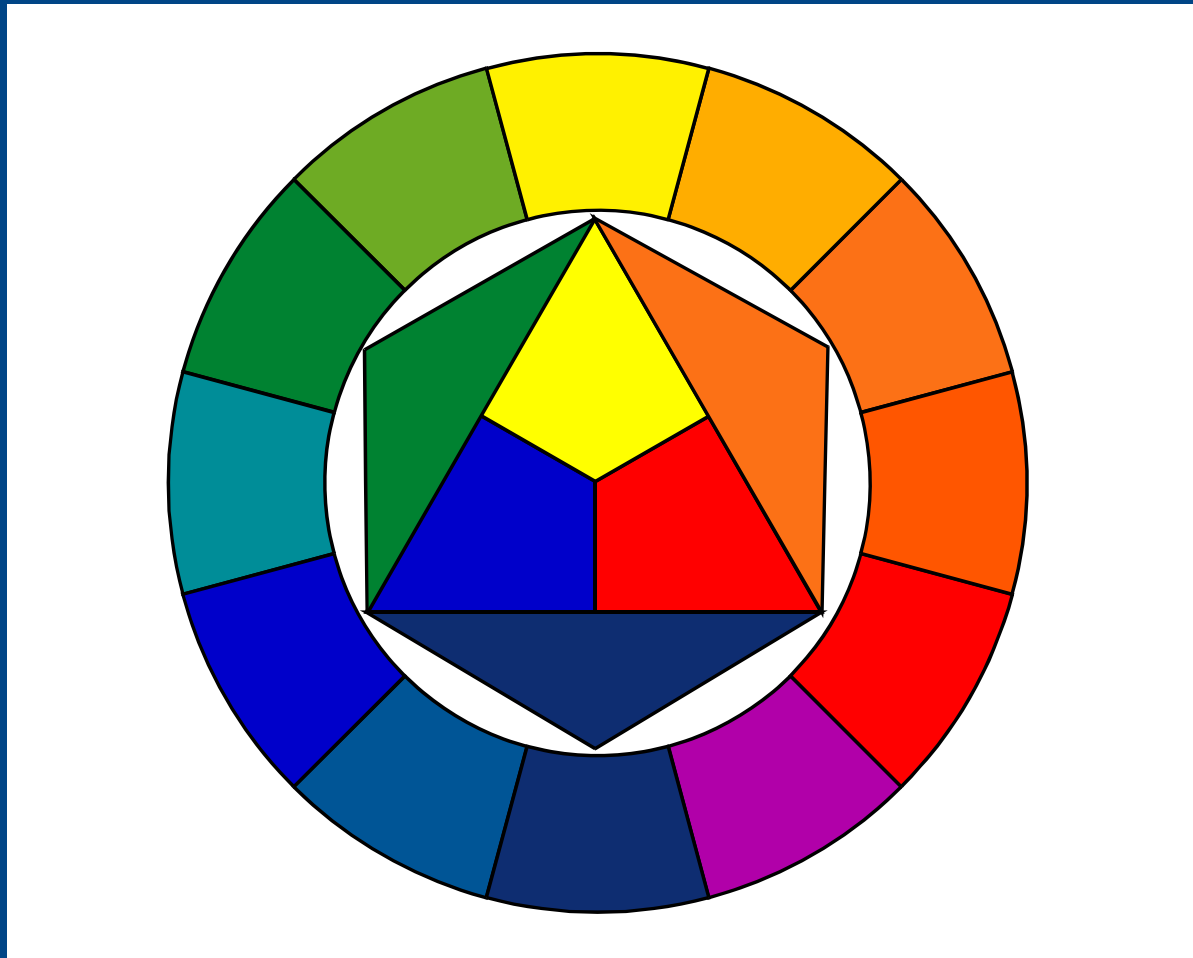
COMPLIMENTARY COLOURS - Complimentary colours are colours that are found directly across from or opposite each other on the colour wheel. When used side by side complimentary colours enhance each other and when mixed together they lower the intensity of each other.

SPLIT-COMPLIMENTS - A split-complimentary colour harmony is one in which the two colours on either side of a compliment are selected rather than the colours actual compliment. An example of this would be Red, Yellow-green, and Blue-green.
